- My dissertation used the case of China and the 2012 U.S. election to explore how the tone of media coverage affects opinions of foreign countries. Using a nationally representative, pre- and post-election panel and an original content analysis of mentions of China on U.S. political television, I showed that an increase in negatively-valenced coverage of China in advance of the election increased individuals' perceived threat from China. I used an original survey experiment to demonstrate the same finding casually, and to show that negatively-valenced campaign ads cause people to discriminate against Asians on an individual level.
